# TROOP 70 MOBILIZATION PLAN

#### 1. SITUATION

Troop 70 may be called upon from time to respond to planned or unplanned emergency conditions for ourselves, the community, or local agencies. This Mobilization Plan provides a structure for timely and dependable communication, and troop mustering.

#### 2. MISSION

The members of Troop 70 maybe called upon to participate in passing information, a mobilization drill, or an actual operation to provide a service to the community.

- A. The execution of this plan may occur on short-notice and at any time.
- B. When a muster of the troop is required, the location will be based on the situation, which will be announced at the mobilization.

#### 3. EXECUTION

- A. The Scoutmaster determines when Troop 70 should participate in a local emergency or exercise. All participation in these is optional, and the first rule is to be safe.
- B. The Scoutmaster prepares a message to be communicated to the troop, and then chooses the method of communicating this message, e.g. email, text message, website, Twitter, phone tree, etc.
- C. If a phone tree is required, the Scoutmaster authorizes the SPL to implement the phone communication plan as shown in the Troop 70 Communications spreadsheet.
- D. At the deployment location, the SPL or other designee will organize the troop, take attendance, and communicate expectations and assignments.
- E. After the event, the SPL will lead an after-action review to improve future deployments.

## 4. MOBILIZATION INSTRUCTIONS

A. Bring a complete personal emergency service pack, and any other required items.

- B. Wear a Field / Class A Uniform unless instructed otherwise.
- C. Be prepared to stay the entire length of deployment, including food and water. Most deployments would be one day.
- D. When arriving at the response location or rally point, scouts and adults will be given assignments, using the Patrol Method.
- E. All communications, questions or requests from anyone not in the troop must be directed through the Scoutmaster or his designees.
- F. Report all injuries received at any time, no matter how minor, to the Scoutmaster and SPL.

#### 5. DEPLOYMENT COMMUNICATION SCRIPT

- A. Give the purpose of the mobilization.
- B. If by phone, have the scout get a pen and paper.
- C. Communicate the location and time.
- D. Define uniform requirement and what to bring.
- E. Gather feedback for Scoutmaster or SPL.
- F. Confirm scout participation.
- G. If by phone, have scout read repeat instructions.

#### 6. PERSONAL EMERGENCY SERVICE PACK

This is for a one-day deployment. Other deployments will use a different packing list.

## A. Clothing

- i. Class A Uniform (unless otherwise directed)
- ii. Sturdy work shoes with extra laces
- iii. Extra clothing layer
- iv. Poncho or rain wear
- v. Hat / Hardhat
- vi. Work gloves
- vii. Watch
- viii. Neckerchief, handkerchief, or triangle bandage

#### B. Personal Gear

- i. Multi-purpose tool or pocketknife (with Totin' Chip card)
- ii. Note pad with pen/pencil
- iii. Headlamp or flashlight

- iv. Map of area / compass
- v. Waterproof bag or trash bag
- vi. Daypack
- vii. Matches / lighter
- viii. Any permission slips or paperwork required including emergency contact information.

# C. Food and Water

- i. Trail/snack food for a full day
- ii. Water bottle (plastic, 32oz, wide mouth is ideal)

# D. Hygiene and Personal Safety

- i. Whistle
- ii. Hand wipes or "wet ones"
- iii. Hand Sanitizer
- iv. Sunscreen
- v. Insect Repellent
- vi. First Aid kit
- vii. Rescue Blanket
